Chisum Patent Academy Seminar Scheduled for March 5-7

CincylP members looking to fulfill some CLE credits might wish to consider an upcoming three-day event: the Chisum Patent Academy's Advanced Patent Seminar, led by internationally known patent law scholars Donald Chisum and Janice Mueller.



The seminar will be held March 5-7 at the 21C Museum Hotel Cincinnati downtown, and it has been approved for 18 CIE credits by the Supreme Court of Ohio's Commission on CIE.

Chisum and Mueller co-founded the Chisum Patent Academy in 2009, after retiring from full-time law teaching. They saw it as a way to continue educating others, specifically in a classic roundtable, interactive seminar style.

Since July 2009, Chisum and Mueller have led 10 of these seminars, addition to occasional in house programs for corporations. Eight of the seminars, including the first five, have been held in Seattle. In 2012 and 2013, they held the "spring seminar" in New York City. But in March, the Chisum Patent Academy will make its Cincinnati debut.

"We're really excited about the possibility of doing these seminars in Cincinnati because, number one, there is an excellent, active patent law bar in the Greater Cincinnati area," Chisum said. "Beyond that, Cincinnati is so convenient to get to and costs are lower."

Chisum and Mueller have intentionally kept the number of seminars they lead each year fairly limited, as both work full time writing their respective treatises. But the demand for more seminars is probably high, largely because of their unique style.

"Our model is really different from the traditional patent law CLE provider, where you are in a big ballroom with hundreds of other people, and its just kind of passive, "Mueller said." On the other hand, it's not for everyone either. We really want people who are engaged and want to participate and want to argue and debate. For some people, it's great fun."

Each of the Advanced Patent Seminars, including the March event in Cincinnati, is limited to 10 participants. Historically, the majority of the attendees come from out of town, including several from other countries such as Irrael, Canada, France and Japan. To encourage Cincyli Pemerbers to register for the upcoming seminarr, they are offering a 10% discount on the typical \$2,000 registration fee (\$1,300). Currently there are still spots available.

Like past seminars, Chisum and Mueller will lead discussions in Cincinnati on both key areas of patent law and more recent developments in federal circuits and the Supreme Court.

"There are some topics that seem to be running topics, where there's some interesting material that we cover and, yet, almost every year there's a new case or twist to the old set of materials," Chisum said.

Registration is open and can be done online at https://dischemcy.com, which includes all of the information and an interaction registration form. It is recommended that potential participants team an email to info/er-bisum.com before attempting to sign up, to ensure there are still openings.

"I encourage people to give this a shot," Mueller said. "It's engaging. It's kind of an intellectual recharge for a lot of people. We have a lot of fun and people make good connections."
